Brighton Marathon Weekend

The 2017 Brighton Marathon Weekend is organised by The Grounded Events Company, which was established in June 2007 by Tim Hutchings (CEO) and Tom Naylor (Managing Director). The inaugural event took place in April 2010 and has since established itself as a premier fixture on the UK's sporting event calendar.

2017 is set to be the biggest event to date with increased participant fields for the Brighton Marathon and the BM10k taking place on Sunday 9th April 2017. The event also comprises The Cancer Research UK Kids & Teens Mini Mile Races for children aged 7-17 (Saturday 8th April), and the 2-day Brighton Marathon Weekend Exhibition (Friday 7th and Saturday 8th April 2017).
